

7-Step Business Startup Blueprint

A practical launch checklist for turning a business idea into a structured operation.

Use this as a simple setup map, then refine, brand, and market the business with intention.

1 Secure a Business Address

Use a real business mailing address, virtual office, or business mailbox before forming accounts. Many virtual business address options commonly range from about \$40 to \$115 per month.

Pro Tip: Choose an address in a business district if possible. It adds instant credibility. Use your new virtual business address (Step 1) as your registered business address when filing, not your home.

2 Form the Business Entity

Search your state's Secretary of State or county business office to find the official formation portal. Follow the state-specific instructions for forming your LLC or other entity.

3 Get Your EIN From the IRS

Apply directly through the IRS website for your Employer Identification Number. Avoid third-party sites that charge unnecessary fees for something you can request directly.

Pro Tip: Apply for your EIN the same day your LLC is approved. You will need both your LLC formation documents and your EIN ready when opening your business bank account. Bring your LLC formation documents, EIN letter, and business address when opening the account. Call ahead to confirm exactly what documents each institution requires.

4 Open a Business Bank Account

Separate business money from personal money immediately. Start with a reputable business bank, Capital One, or a strong local credit union.

5 Build the Basic Brand Foundation

Create the business name presentation, logo direction, website, social profiles, brand message, and contact path so customers know who you are and how to reach you.

Pro Tip: Consistency across your name, logo, address, and contact info on every platform builds trust and improves your search visibility. Use the exact same business name everywhere. Apply for at least 3-5 Net30 accounts in your first 90 days. Paying each one on time establishes a payment history with multiple vendors, which accelerates your business credit score significantly.

6 Establish Business Credit Basics

Use Net30 vendor accounts responsibly to begin building a payment history. Quill & Uline are common starter vendors for business owners.

7 Track Income and Expenses From Day One

Keep clean records of revenue, startup fees, marketing, advertising, travel, phone, transportation, software, and other business expenses. Strong records protect clarity, taxes, and decision-making.

Pro Tip: Work with a CPA or payroll company before your first filing, not after. The cost of professional guidance in Year 1 pays for itself many times over in deductions you would otherwise miss.
